TRAINING COURSES – 2012 SEASON

Mylor Yacht Club is an RYA Recognised Training Centre approved to run all RYA shore-based Courses and the main RYA Powerboat Courses. We also run our own Club Courses for our members

If we have unfilled spaces on any of our Courses, members of other local clubs, both Sailing and Rowing, are welcome to join them for an extra Administration Fee of £7 for full day courses and £5 for half-day courses.

Our prices are similar to those of Local Education Evening Classes, and are much cheaper than those of Commercial Companies. Prices shown include the Course Fee as well as the non-member administration fee and all required Booklets.

Shore-based Courses - 2012:

RYA-Diesel Engine Maintenance: (Saturday 7th January – Full Day) Course £47

Mechanical failure is the main cause of lifeboat callouts. Basic maintenance and engine care experience may ensure you don't become part of these statistics. This one-day Course gives you the ability to take simple measures to prevent mechanical breakdown at sea and rectify defects that do not require workshop support.

MYC-Advanced Diesel Engine/Trouble-Shooting: (2) (Tues 10th January –Half Day) Course £18 **One am and one pm.**

This half-day Course is for those who have already taken the RYA Diesel Engine Maintenance Course, and who wish to extend their knowledge still further, particularly in respect of 'trouble-shooting' a range of problems.

RYA-Introduction to RADAR: (2) (Sat 14th Jan & Sat 17th March - Full Day) Course £52

Sailing and motor yachts increasingly have RADAR on board, and the IRPCS state that, if you have it on board, you must know how to use it. This one-day Course provides an understanding of RADAR as an aid to navigation and collision avoidance at sea.

MYC-RADAR – Follow-Up: (Tues 17th January - Half Day – am) Course £18

This half-day Course is for those who have already taken the RYA Introduction to RADAR course and who are looking to further their knowledge of the practical uses of RADAR at sea.

RYA-First Aid at Sea Certificate: (Sat 11th February - Full Day) Course £50.50

In a medical emergency at sea a little first aid knowledge and immediate action can save lives. This one-day Course provides a working knowledge of first aid for people using small craft. It also satisfies the requirements of some categories of commercial work afloat. First Aid Certificates are only valid for 3-years, so check if yours needs renewal this year!

RYA-Marine VHF Radio – (SRC) Certificate: (Sat 18th February - Full Day) Course £46 + VHF Certificate £30

If you own a fixed or hand-held marine VHF radio, you must hold this Certificate by law. This is a one-day Course from scratch, and includes training on Digital Selective Calling (DSC) and emergency procedures. You can learn and test your prior knowledge via the RYA interactive Training Website @ www.ryainteractive.org. A radio is an essential piece of safety equipment, and it is vital to understand the correct procedures.

MYC-Chart Correction Workshop: (Saturday 25th February - Full Day) Course £25

This full-day Session aims to guide you through the process of downloading chart updates from Websites, and then to help you make the necessary corrections on your own charts.

RYA- Sea Survival: (Sunday 26th February - Full Day) Course £67

This one-day course prepares you to stay alive in an emergency. You will spend valuable time doing practical drills in a Life Raft, and you will learn basic survival techniques and how to use all the safety equipment on your boat. As well as being a genuine 'lifesaver', it is also great fun to do!

MYC-Electronic Navigation Techniques: (Tues 6th March - Half Day - am) Course £18

This is an informal half-day Course which focuses on making the transition from basic to electronic navigation techniques, and the use of GPS and chart plotters. It is based around the RYA DVD entitled 'The Electronic Yachtmaster' by Tom Cunliffe.

MYC-Introduction to AIS: (Tuesday 13th March – Half Day – am) Course £18

AIS enables vessels and shore stations to transmit and receive information regarding identification, position, course and speed of vessels, and it could change the way we navigate in the future. This course covers what AIS can offer you in terms of navigation and safety aids and how to use it.

MYC-Methods of Recovery of MOB: (Saturday 15th September – Full Day) Course £29

This course starts with a presentation showing a variety of recovery equipment and methods of retrieval of a MOB from the sea on to a yacht or motor cruiser deck. The rest of the day is spent aboard members' yachts anchored in Carrick Roads, watching at close hand, practical demonstrations of all these methods of recovery from sea to deck.

Water-based Courses - 2012:

RYA Powerboat L.2 Certificate (PBL.2): (Sat/Sun 10th/11th March – W/E) Course £82

This Certificate is a pre-requisite for the Safety Boat Certificate. It is for those with at least one season's experience of small powerboats. The practical Course and Assessment covers a range of manoeuvres and boat handling skills, together with an oral or written test covering the theory. Certification is now held on the RYA On-line Central Registration Scheme.

RYA Safety Boat Certificate (SB): (Sat/Sun 31st March/1st April – W/E) Course £83

Candidates for this Course and Assessment must already hold the PBL.2 Certificate. The syllabus focuses on the skills and knowledge required to operate as a Safety/Escort Boat for racing fleets of dinghies. It covers specific rescue and towing techniques for a wide variety of craft, and comprises a practical assessment and an oral or written test.

RYA-ICC Assessment: (International Certificate of Competence):

(Date to be agreed with allocated Assessor) Assessment £45 + ICC Cert £40 + Handbook £7

European countries are increasingly requiring visiting yachtsmen to hold an ICC when cruising in their waters. It is broadly equivalent to the RYA Day Skipper Practical level, and is the minimum requirement to charter a boat. All the navigation theory and practical tasks are outlined in the RYA ICC Handbook and applicants should be familiar with all the assessment requirements in advance. These assessments are carried out on an individual basis aboard the applicant's own boat.

RYA-European Inland Waterways (CEVNI) Certificate:

(Date to be agreed with allocated Assessor) Assessment £22 + Handbook £5

This is an endorsement to the ICC Certificate above, and is a required qualification for cruising the Inland Waterways of Europe, excluding the UK. The RYA CEVNI Handbook is mandatory and must be carried aboard when using inland waterways. It covers all the "rules of the road" you will need to know. The CEVNI Test comprises 30 multi-choice questions and is a written exam which takes less than an hour.
